

Found at the West End of the Kentucky Capitol is the first monument honoring a woman on state-owned land, the monument honors Nettie Depp.

Nettie Depp (1874-1932), born and raised in Glasgow, KY represents extraordinary leadership as a teacher, principal, elected official, and advocate. In 1913, seven

years before women earned the right to vote, Depp was elected as Superintendent of Barren County Schools, becoming the first female elected official in the county.

Nettie was the daughter of John Burks Depp, a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives, and Mariba Elizabeth Reneau Depp and was one of six children. She became a teacher and principal, an education reformer. Her experience and determination to enact change made her a prime candidate for the upcoming superintendent election. Local school superintendents were not selected by a school board, but rather they were elected by the voters and were considered to be county officials.

On January 1, 1914, Depp became the county's first female officeholder, in additional to her modest salary, she was provided an office and an apartment in the county courthouse. In her time in office, one of her greatest accomplishments was the creation of Barren County's first fouryear high school. School enrollment jumped from 20 students to over 70 and the faculty doubled in size, within two-year the number of students grew to 106.

During her term, Depp also partnered with the University of Kentucky Agriculture Extension office to create a corn and tomato club within the public school, according to Depp this eventually became the first 4-H club in the county.

After her term as superintendent, she continued to serve as a teacher and principal until her death on August 3, 1932. An estimated 1,500 people attended her funeral underscoring her impact on the community, education, and the people she knew.

Nettie Depp has been honored by many awards and accolades since her years of service. Amanda Matthews, Sculptor stated that this sculpture not only represents an accomplished woman but reflects civil rights, women's contributions to society, and voices of unity and inclusion through public art. Matthews is an internationally recognized, award-winning sculptor/ designer of public art, and the CEO of Prometheus Foundry, LLC.



We are also home to the Barren County Innovation Zone and BAVEL, a virtual school for grades k-12. Additionally, Barren County Area Technology Center, a regional facility, is located on our high school campus.

Barren County Schools offers a pipeline of success by providing options for each student from preschool to postsecondary. Through rigorous instruction, magnet school programs, and accelerated classroom spaces, Barren County works to challenge students academically in a variety of ways.

With 35 career pathways, BC students are prepared for the transition to work or post-secondary education. Barren County Area Technology Center

Located on the campus of Barren County High School, the Barren County ATC (Area Tech Center) serves students from Barren County High School, Caverna High School, Glasgow High School, & Hart County High School. The facility currently offers 12 programs:

Automotive Computer Programming Electricity Industrial Maintenance

Business Management Construction **Health Sciences Machine Tool**

Computer-Aided Drafting (CAD)

Diesel **HVAC** Welding

The ATC offers co-op programs, apprenticeships and internships to seniors that are industry certified and meet the qualifications. This allows students to get real world training while in high school. Along with industry certifications, students are able to become OSHA-10 certified in the construction industry for that pathway. Students are also eligible to receive dual credit for their courses at the ATC for their post-secondary route at SouthCentral Kentucky Community & Technical College (SKYCTC).

Barren County ATC works closely with local business & industry to identify workplace needs in our community. They work together to close the gaps in the workplace while also serving the students needs and wants while in high school & trying to plan for their pathway to success.

Ashley Burd is the fifth principal of Barren County ATC, which was originally called Glasgow Vocational School & then renamed as the Barren County Vocational School in 1974. Ms. Burd follows in the footsteps of Bob Sullivan, Don Williams, Max Doty, & Hal Toms.

Glasgow City Schools



My name is Katie Lester. I am a freshman attending the University of Kentucky and I am currently in the First Year Engineering program and I am also majoring in Mechanical **Engineering. Glasgow High School** prepared me more than I probably realized with the future that is ahead of me. They have not only taken the responsibility of our high school careers but the beginning of our future ones as well. They don't just want to see us walk across the stage with a high school diploma, they want us to be prepared for the next steps of our lives.

At Glasgow, there is an engineering program called Project Lead the Way. Through this program you can get insight on particular fields that you are interested in such as aerospace, computer science, electrical and civil engineering. I completed the electrical engineering pathway, which sparked my interest in pursuing an engineering degree. Transition to Engineering class is the first class you will take as a freshman

if you were to attend the University of Kentucky. Glasgow is one of the few schools who have been certified to offer the class. This has allowed me to have the chance to complete two college credits towards an engineering degree at UK. I have learned the basics of a programming language called MATLAB. MATLAB allows you to write code that tells a machine component what task you want it to complete. Another part of the engineering department is TSA, a club where students interested in stem can combine other interests outside the stem field. I have been a part of this club for three years and have competed in unmanned aerial vehicle competitions.

Overall, I can say I wouldn't change anything about going Glasgow High School. I can confidently say that I would not be the person standing here today if I had gone anywhere else. You can never 100% prepare for the future, but you can have a strong base to start on and that is exactly what this school has done for me - A strong foundation.



More than 700 students who graduated from area high schools in spring 2022 are eligible for the new SKY Merit and enhanced DC to Finish scholarships at Southcentral Kentucky Community and Technical College (SKYCTC). Barren County and Glasgow Schools had 96 students eligible for either a SKY Merit or DC to Finish scholarship representing a total of \$273,000 in merit-based scholarship dollars!

The number of scholarships awarded across SKYCTC's service area is a testament to the high caliber of students graduating from local schools. In fact, high school graduates are entering SKYCTC with an average high school GPA of 3.2*. This means that the average first-time incoming student could receive \$2,000 per year with the SKY Merit scholarship, which is about half the cost of a full year of tuition.

SKYCTC's affordable tuition and the opportunity to graduate with little to no student debt have drawn much attention from savvy high school students and their parents. Students like Chloe Cook, a 2022 high school graduate, are looking more closely at the wages of their future careers and considering the impact of tuition costs and student debt. Chloe started at SKYCTC this fall and is taking advantage of the DC to Finish Scholarship while she studies to become a high school math teacher. "I come from a small high school and didn't want to start at a university right away," says Chloe Cook. "My high school counselor spoke very highly of SKY, and since I got the DC to Finish scholarship, I knew SKY would be the best choice for me. So far, my experience has been great! My instructors seem like they really care."

Here are a few of the scholarship opportunities at SKYCTC:

- The DC to Finish Scholarship is the top-tier of the SKYCTC merit scholarships offered to first-time first-year students beginning Fall 2022. It provides \$5,000 per academic year to students who complete nine or more SKYCTC dual credit hours with a SKYCTC GPA of 3.0 or better.
- College scholarships are also available by category. Some scholarships are general need-based scholarships for students in any field, while others are dedicated to students in specific disciplines, such as culinary arts, HVAC, and nursing.
- The SKY Merit Scholarship is also for first-time first-year students beginning Fall 2022. The annual award amount ranges from \$1,000 to \$4,000 and is based on the student's high school GPA.
- The Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship (WRKS) can pay a student's total tuition bill. WRKS is not based on a student's income and allows students to earn up to 60 credit hours in high-demand career fields. Nearly all programs offered at SKYCTC qualify for the WRKS.

WKU in Glasgow Marks 20th Anniversary of Campus -Looks Ahead to the Future



In 2002, WKU Glasgow officially opened its beautiful new campus at 500 Hilltopper Way in Glasgow. The hilltop campus was the culmination of tireless efforts to establish a permanent home for the regional campus to bring even more educational opportunities to the citizens of Barren and surrounding counties.

This October, WKU celebrated the 20th anniversary of WKU in Glasgow's permanent home, with a nod to WKU's rich history in Glasgow-Barren County and a look ahead at its vision for serving future generations throughout this great region.

Looking Toward the Future

WKU is committed to offering four-year degrees at the WKU in Glasgow campus. Students complete the entirety of WKU's Colonnade plan, or general education requirements, at the Glasgow campus. Students then finish their degree in Glasgow, online, or in Bowling Green. High-demand fields like Elementary Education, Middle Grades Education, Public Health, Criminology, Psychology, Health Sciences, and many others are offered at WKU in Glasgow. Students can also earn a dual certification in Elementary Education/Special Education.

WKU in Glasgow staff work hand-in-hand with WKU Admissions, visit area high school students, attend community events, and provide guidance through the enrollment process.

Making higher education affordable and accessible for high school graduates and adult learners is a top priority. In fall 2022, nearly 85% of WKU's incoming class received institutional scholarship support!

WKU has made affording college easy through:

The Hilltopper Guarantee ensures 100% tuition coverage for any first-time, first-year freshman from Kentucky who receives Pell Grant assistance and has at least a 3.0 cumulative unweighted high school GPA.

Automatic Academic Merit Scholarships are available for students with a 3.0 unweighted GPA. These are offered automatically after first-time freshmen apply to WKU with no separate application.

TOPDollarisWKU's single application to find all privately supported scholarships the University offers. Students are matched to scholarships based on factors such as geographic location, major field of study, involvement in extracurricular activities, hobbies and interests, associations and memberships, specific personal characteristics, or financial need.

Transfer Scholarships are automatically offered in amounts up to \$4,000 annually to transfer students; there is no separate application.

New Early College of WKU in Glasgow

Beginning fall 2023, select area high school students will have the opportunity to complete their first year of college at WKU in Glasgow through the new Early College program. Students will earn 30 hours of college credit during their high school junior and senior years by taking classes at WKU in Glasgow alongside current WKU college students.

"Early College at WKU in Glasgow creates a new opportunity for high school students to fully immerse in the college experience and get an affordable jumpstart on their WKU degree," said WKU Regional Campus Director Dr. Derick Strode.

According to Dr. Strode, five Professional Career Tracks were selected based on workforce needs in the region:

Agriculture Crime & Legal Studies Nursing (BSN)

Business Management Elementary Education

Students will take college courses within their selected track at WKU in Glasgow each morning and finish the day each afternoon at their high school. They will also take two field trips each semester: one to WKU Bowling Green campus and one to a local business within the student's Professional Career Track.

Tuition will be billed to students at the dual credit rate, which is a fraction of typical tuition rates, and KHEAA Work Ready & Dual Credit Scholarships will also be available to cover most courses.

Participating schools are those in Glasgow and Barren County, as well as some immediately adjacent counties.

Info sessions will begin at participating high schools in November. Students must apply through their high school during their sophomore year and will be selected in March 2023 to prepare for their Fall 2023 start.

2010 Dr. Juanita Bayless retires as WKU Glasgow Director after holding that position for many years.

2013 WKU celebrated its 25th year as a WKU regional campus.




Glenview Health Care Facility is a luxurious assisted senior living facility that provides a

In efforts to continue meeting the future needs of our customers, GWC has budgeted over \$5 million in projects to enhance and improve the water distribution system. CEA owns, operates, and maintains the Cave City and the Horse Cave Wastewater Treatment Plants and Pretreatment Plant which serve the Cave City, Park City, Mammoth Cave, Horse Cave, Bonnieville, and the Chalybeate area sewer systems. CEA also provides and maintains water service for Cave City, Park City and Mammoth Cave. Caveland Environmental Authority, Inc. has our own construction division. The professional construction crews of CEA make it possible to do all of their own water and sewer construction which provides a significant cost savings for their customers.

CEA's Environmental Division provides quality

portable restroom rentals and restroom trailers for the South Central Kentucky area. Industrial pumping needs such as restaurant grease traps, car wash grit tanks, oil/water separators, industrial wastewater, surface and underground storage tanks, and sludge removal are easily met with their state of the art vacuum trucks. The environmental division can respond quickly to emergency situations such as spills. Customers can be confident that their waste will be transported and disposed of at one of CEA's treatment plants.

Caveland Environmental Authority, Inc. is very involved within the community. CEA

has sponsored local, state, and national organizations and public schools. CEA is a continuing sponsor of Environmental Education both for local schools and the general public. Caveland Environmental Authority. Inc. has and will continue to grow in our knowledge and expertise in an effort to meet the needs of the communities we serve while placing environmental protection as a top priority. CEA has and will continue to take great strides in preserving the resources of today to allow for a cleaner and safer environment for the generations of tomorrow.



Farmers RECC

Farmers RECC is a not-for-profit electric cooperative, serving more than 26,000 services across eleven Kentucky counties, with a mission to provide reliable, competitivelypriced energy that will enhance the quality of life for our member-owners and communities.

In Barren County, Farmers RECC, in conjunction with their power supplier, East Kentucky Power Cooperative, operates the Glasgow Landfill-Gas-To-Energy (LFGTE) plant. The plant harvests methane from the Glasgow Landfill and turns it into electricity, powering approximately 500 homes in the area.

The project was designed to be easily expanded as the landfill grows and more methane gas is produced.

In addition, the LFGTE project is providing a backup source of power to the Glasgow Water Company's waste water treatment plant, saving them from having to make a considerable investment to provide their own backup power source.

Farmers RECC was also able to assist the T.J. Community Mission Foundation by securing a \$2 Million zero-interest loan through the USDA Rural Economic Development Loan (REDLG) program. The loan aided in construction of the T. J. Community Mission Foundation Shanti Niketan Hospice Home.

The 10,400 square foot facility, located on Glenview Drive, opened in 2021 and included 8 inpatient rooms, kitchen and living spaces, and private areas for families and guests.

The loan funds were disbursed to the T. J. Community Mission Foundation and will be re-paid over time through donations to the Foundation and normal operations of the Hospice Home.



South Central Rural Telecommunication Cooperative (SCRTC)

South Central Rural Telecommunication Cooperative (SCRTC) was formed in 1950 to provide telephone service in local areas where larger providers would not serve. In 1995, they began offering internet services, and in 2002 added Digital Television as part of their lineup. Due to the vast changes in the communication industry, SCRTC has diversified their services to remain a vibrant and growing company for over 70 years. In addition to phone, TV and Internet, services now also include security, personal emergency response systems (PERS), surveillance, Wi-Fi, Hosted PBX (VoIP), metro ethernet and commercial advertising.

Barren County Tourism





Cave Country has long been a tourism mecca for not only the state of Kentucky, but the entire United States, and once Mammoth Cave became the official longest cave system in the world, tourists began flocking in from all over the globe. Barren County's tourism industry was built on the legendary cave system that Glasgow and the surrounding countryside sits on. Not to mention Glasgow's charming downtown that houses not only the historic Plaza Theatre that has offered live concerts and plays for generations, and boasts a history of performers including names like Lorretta Lynn and Whiskey


Myers, but also a healthy variety of locally owned boutiques, drinkeries, and restaurants. These as sets accompanied with recent energy and growth are truly shaping the area into a Southern Kentucky destination.

This became even more apparent during the COVID pandemic as the overall tourism industry took a heavy hit, yet the local tourism industry flourished. 2021 was a banner year for Glasgow-Barren County Tourism with \$78.6 million in direct visitor spending and over \$100 million in total visitor spending. These outcomes are the highest ever for the area and an increase of 33% from 2020, which exceeded the previous increase of 14% from 2019 to 2020. "Barren County's unique footing as an outdoor adventure destination in a central location within driving distance from many states made it a premier vacation choice during a time when travelers were looking for open spaces, serene moments, and peaceful rural landscapes," said MacLean Lessenberry, Executive Director of Glasgow-Barren County Tourist & Convention Commission.

Although the great outdoors is the top reason people visit, there are many others following that include the Scottish heritage, the Civil War history, and the overall small town ambiance. As the official destination marketing organization for Glasgow and Barren County, Glasgow-Barren County Tourist & Convention Commission promotes the community overall and ensures that everyone knows the area is worth the trip, no matter the reason. The organization's mission is to develop and market Glasgow and the surrounding area as a welcoming destination for visitors. A true, unwavering belief in the county's ability to grow and thrive through forward thinking and dedication to the region is at the very core of the commission and its work. Judge Executive Micheal Hale noted that he often encounters travelers in downtown Glasgow who are in town for the plethora of outdoor adventure options, but are out experiencing the rest of the amenities offered. "Tourism is a vital part of the local economy as well as a key driver behind quality of life development in the area, which directly impacts the growth of industry. Companies desire to be located in cities that have great amenities-and usually those amenities align with the types of experiences that tourists want to have, which is why a vibrant tourism sector is indispensable."Glasgow-Barren County Tourism's main office and visitors center is located at 118 East Public Square in Glasgow, and a staffed kiosk can be found inside of the Visitors Center in Mammoth Cave National Park. "Every day I get to meet people who feel just like family," says owner Cherie Vaughn about her Main Street Bed and Breakfast. Cherie was working four jobs to pay for a one-bedroom house in Denver in 2018. So when her friend talked her into coming to look at operating a bed and breakfast, she and her dog packed up and came to Glasgow where she says she meets friends daily in her 200 year old home. Here, visitors can choose from one of four rooms, or "the cottage", which was once the house kitchen.

"We travel to lots of small towns that are starting to revitalize. We want to be a part of that in Glasgow. If you want to do something, then do it. Be a part of change. Make it better." Beth Wagner's words are the inspiration behind her two "home away from homes". Beth owns "Balcony on Broadway" and "The Wilbur". These modern accommodations bring charm to the Glasgow square. As the name implies, the roof is a key feature of "Balcony on Broadway" complete with the perfect view of the square to be enjoyed in this exposed brick personality loft. While "The Wilbur" boasts a contemporary style where the visitor can literally step out onto the Glasgow square.

Cave City Convention Center

The Cave City Convention Center is one of South Central Kentucky's premier meeting spaces. The convention center is located just off interstate 65 at exit 53, midway between Louisville and Nashville, making it centrally located for associations across the state. This full-service facility in the heart of Cave Country host 110-120 events annually ranging from 25 people to 2,000 in attendance from Chamber of Commerce signature events, company holiday parties to the annual teacher's banquet, the center will see as many as 15,000 people come through its doors each year.

This 12,000 square foot facility houses the main auditorium with seating for up to 700 as well as six breakout rooms for small gatherings or meetings. The Center has five full-time and five part-time staff, and partners with Diane's Cakes and Catering for all their event catering needs. This team works together to bring over \$1,000,000 in economic impact to the community each year.

Collaboration on the Square

Barren County has an abundance of small, unique boutiques and gift shops in all parts of the county, everything from handmade crafts such as woodwork, hand poured candles, and jewelry to beautiful home décor, awards, wedding gifts, baby gifts and an outfit for any occasion. What makes our shops exceptional though is the partnerships you find between the various shop owners.

When we talk about supporting local, we are typically engaging with the community at large to support small business, but what happens when those business start working together to promote each other collectively. That is something truly special.

It all started with a social media message. Sophie Wood, owner of Green Street Gifts took the initiative to reach out to eight other retail businesses around the Glasgow Square about starting a sidewalk sale, she was met with very willing participants. Logos were created, and Vintique's Veronika Wells designed a brochure with a map pinpointing each participating business's location and was sent to people around the square to visit the many different stores. Together Awards Inc., Green

Street Gifts, Off the Square, Roots & Ramble Boutique, Spring Valley Boutique, The Good Wife House of Lingerie & Beauty and Vintique's vision was to create a fun environment for downtown.

Each business promotes the different events on social media and spreads the word to visiting customers about the upcoming collaborations. In addition to the sidewalk sales, the business owners collaborate on a number of other events such as back to school sales, Sip, Shop & Stroll, Shindig on the Scare in October, Small Business Saturday, and Christmas Open Houses. Each owner asks what the customer coming in is looking for and points them in the right direction of other local businesses if they do not carry what the customer is looking for.

This collaboration works so well because each business owner is supportive of the other. They all have a similar vision for growing downtown and bringing people to the square.

Because Dance is for Everyone - SOMA

SOMA Center for Dance, owned and directed by Trevor Dylan Edwards, is on a mission to make high-quality, cutting-edge dance education more accessible to everyday people because dance is for everybody.

"I became interested in dance when I was in the Glasgow Scottie Band. My clarinet private lessons teacher, Pam Yakel, said I was born to be a dancer. She was the first person to help me confirm that is what I wanted to do. She saw the potential in me, and then before I knew it, I had a full scholarship to WKU."

Trevor, a graduate of Western Kentucky University with a B.A. in Dance and Performing Arts Administration, is a Glasgow native who desired to be an educator with the flexibility and freedom of creating his own work.

"I picked Glasgow because I wanted young people here to have the training to help them succeed. I knew I wanted to teach concert dance and bring excellence here by teaching the history, technique, and terminology that provides the foundational skills that students need to go to the next level of dance."

SOMA offers a wide range of classes and programs throughout the year. Students can participate in performances, competition teams and summer camps such as Sparks!, Smart Training, LevelUp and Summer Series.

"My favorite part about SOMA is the community that we have built together. It's so special to watch students grow together and see the techniques being used. They get to have a lot of fun doing the shows and it's clear they are having a great time."

The instructors at SOMA teach ballet, tumbling,

modern dance, jazz, contemporary, pointe, tap, hip hop, and improv classes. There are 4 annual performances a year: 2 advance company only and 2 everyone dances. Every winter SOMA presents the Nutcracker, a true highlight of the year.

"My biggest influencer in business is Christina Rice, a business coach, who was featured in Forbes for advocating for women of color in the health and wellness space. I listen to her podcast about business energetics and creating a business that is sustainable. She taught me that I should not get caught up on the things that we have to do, and to not be afraid to shift. If something isn't working, then let it go. As for my biggest influencer in dance, it would be Candie McCord with the Stephen Foster Association in Bardstown. I have danced with her every year since college."

SOMA recently introduced Pay-what-you-can Pricing because they believe that dance should be accessible to everyone, and that cost should never prevent someone with a passion from getting the education they deserve.

"As for 2023 plans, I am very excited about upcoming shows - Eden recreating the creation story of the Bible through dance, with original ballet. We will be doing Alice in Wonderland, and expanding our classes to offer more acting, vocals, and visual arts."

It is evident that SOMA values passion and expression that can be demonstrated through dance. Everyone can dance, as long as you are moving you are dancing.

ake yourself back to March 2020. What were you thinking? If you were a business owner it won't take long for you to recount the questions that you had. Will they really close my doors? How will I pay my bills, my employees? Will they be able to support their families? Will I be able to provide for my family? We remember that as a stressful time filled with many questions and few answers.

Having raised a family in Glasgow, the Heltsley family was familiar with the complaint about the lack of activities available for youth, specifically the absence of a place for kids to call their own. That was the driving force behind the investment the Heltsley's and their extended family members made in 2012 with the purchase of the 65,000 square foot vacant building that previously housed the Carhartt Distribution Center and Handmacher Garment Factory. The new owners' investment included repurposing the building to bring

Ralphie's Fun Center to the community.

In addition to arcades and Laser Tag, they built a skating rink and a state of the art bowling alley that has hosted high school district, regional, and state tournaments. They have served as hosts to large community events and expos and expanded to offer full food service.

The growth meant that Jason Kuykendall would leave his job in 2014 as a geologist to oversee the family business. At one point during his management, Jason noticed that their property lines included some wooded acreage on the back side of the property. But, as it happens during the growth mode of a new business, there was never time to explore exactly what was available there.

Return to March 2020. March 22, 2020 at 9 am to be exact. The governor issued an executive order mandating that all non life-sustaining retail businesses were to be closed. Like so many other businesses, Ralphie's could not avoid closure. Filled with all the emotions every business owner felt on that day, as he locked the doors and turned his back to his family business, Jason found himself

facing that wooded area on the back of the property. Fifteen minutes did not pass before he had a chainsaw fired up and axes swinging, clearing a path in the overgrown woods. In the days and weeks to come, the more he cleared, the more the vision came into focus for The Grove.

By the time the doors to Ralphie's Fun Center reopened in June 2020, the wooded area on the back side of the property had been cleared, a stage had been built, and the outdoor venue was ready to meet the concerns of people needing to gather for entertainment and meeting space in a safe, outdoor, open-air facility.

The Grove's first national touring act to perform was Michael Cleveland in October 2020. The first full season of 2021 brought branding, social media platforms, consistent growth, and shows including: The Josephines, Forever Abbey Road, and the John Prine

Tribute night.

Knowing that 2022 would mark a year of returning to some sense of normalcy, the team at The Grove was determined to achieve regional recognition as an outdoor venue. The season opened

in April with The Travelin' McCourys. Other headlining bands to perform included Keller Williams and The Local Honeys. They have also expanded to rentals for weddings, meetings, dinners, parties and events. The Grove has also partnered with many community and non-profit organizations to host outdoor events.

Future plans include the addition of a VIP Treehouse section for an elevated perspective of performances. The opening show for 2023 will be announced prior to the new year and a full schedule is planned. A current listing will be available on all social media outlets of The Grove.

AGRICULTURE

Thank an Ag Teacher

As the morning dew glistens on the fescue and clover while the buzz of a mower moves across the fields in all stretches of the county, there is a common theme you will hear. "Yes, I took an Ag class in high school."

In the foreground, there may be spring calves frolicking about as they finish up the morning nursing at the side of their mamas. Just down the road a bit you will likely see blooming soybeans whose acreage now far exceeds that of the burley that sustained us for generations.

A newcomer to the area may wonder how Barren County came to become so productive in many areas. It obviously did not happen overnight. "We have been abundantly blessed with extremely productive soil in this region" says current Ag Extension Agent, (Ag teacher in Barren County for 20 years), Chris Schalk. "But using the soil appropriately requires knowledge, education."

From the last recorded count, we find ourselves surrounded by over 250,000 acres of land in agriculture production (kyagr.com). What it is being used for, has been guided by some of the best. How did Barren County farmers become great at what they do? The ability to adapt, evolve, keep up with the times; whatever you desire to call it, farming has always been and is a constantly changing venture. Most of the county's Production Agriculturists were educated here locally in Agriculture and were members of FFA.

The names of Jewell Colliver, Frank Newberry and Aaron Bates from years ago will be familiar to many. Generations of us also learned from teachers and FFA Advisors including, but not limited to, Jerry Greer, James W. Bailey, Frank Rowland, and Chris Schalk.

These are just some of the men who took 13- to 18-year-olds from chopping out tobacco and feeding baby Holsteins on their family's farm and helped them develop the skill and confidence to help become part of the world's most productive farmers.

Yes, technology has played a large role in helping farms to become more productive. It was estimated that in 1960 one farm fed themselves and 26 others (farmflavor.com). Today, farms are feeding themselves and about 166 here and around the world (fb.org).

But someone had to teach others how to capitalize on these improvements in equipment and technology. The advancements in methodology over the last sixty years is mind boggling!

Although James Bailey and Frank Rowland may be retired after teaching Agriculture at Barren County High School from its opening day in 1973 until 1997 and 1999, respectively, you will still find them involved in Barren County agriculture; someway, somehow, every day.

After breakfast at George J's, it may be off to a meeting at the Extension office, a Barren County Farm Bureau meeting or assisting the Temple Hill Lion's Club with hosting Livestock shows. We as a community owe much to those who work to also teach youth that without labor, neither knowledge nor wisdom can accomplish much.

Next time you are driving along and notice the cattle, hay and grain fields dominating the beautiful landscape, you may remember Paul Harvey sharing the phrase, "So God made a Farmer."
